



You have the right to receive a "Good Faith Estimate" explaining how much your therapy services will cost

Under the law, health care providers need to give patients who don't have insurance or who are not using insurance an estimate of the bill for medical items and services.

- You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate for the total expected cost of any therapy services. This includes related costs like equipment and any fees.
- Adaptive Rehab Clinic will give you a Good Faith Estimate in writing at least 1 business day before your therapy services. You can also ask Adaptive Rehab Clinic, and any other provider you choose, for a Good Faith Estimate before you schedule an item or service.
- If you receive a bill that is at least \$400 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill.
- Make sure to save a copy or picture of your Good Faith Estimate.
